

The Kingdom of God

1. Written as a history; chronology is carefully constructed

2. Written as an epic journey (Greek)

Jerusalem to Rome

A small band of followers to a worldwide movement

Through riots, shipwrecks, prison, etc.

3. Acts: ascension of the king in Jerusalem to the message reaching the emperor in Rome to give homage

Major Events/Topics

- 1. Announcement of the New King, the New Kingdom and the New Covenant
- 2. Demonstration of power at each new stage
- 3. Identification of resistance at each new stage
- 4. Carefully repeated & demonstrated responses to the message
- 5. Clear demonstration of Jesus' authority to direct the church
- 6. Honest & unvarnished representation of life in the church

- 2. Herod(s)
- 3. Interaction with rulers
- 4. Jesus' teaching lived out
