Coins for Kids

Coins for Kids is a grass-roots fundraiser implemented by HOPEworldwide's Athens Chapter (aka, Athens Adoption Resource Program or AARP). The premise is simple: give everyone the chance to make a difference in the life of an orphan. Whether we're young sons and daughters, moms and dads, grandparents, or whole families, we all put our spare change somewhere – the ashtray in our cars, plastic cups, glass jars, on top of our dressers...we save it for those moments when we need a little money for the parking meter, to buy some juice from a child's lemonade stand, rent a movie, pay for lunch, or when we're out of cash and payday is still a few days off. We save those spare coins for our times of need; why not share it with those in the greatest need - orphans?

Enter the pastel-colored, plastic baby bottles with a simple pink or baby-blue ribbon tied around its neck: a gentle reminder that there are children who need that spare change a whole lot more than we do. Placing this staple of virtually every American household in a visible spot in our homes helps us keep orphans near the top of our mental checklist.

The results have been encouraging. Since February, \$1,387.75 has been collected in these baby bottles. Combined with existing funds, *Coins for Kids* has helped the adoption efforts of three families to bring home five (possibly six) sons and daughters: one (possibly 2) children from China, three brothers from South America, and a young girl from India. Spare change helps make a difference!

Since its inception in 2004, the *Athens Adoption Resource Program* (formerly the *Athens Adoption Ministry*) has spent over \$72,000 to support 31 families and 5 foreign orphanages/children's AIDS homes. Of each dollar spent, the percentage of each dollar that supports orphans is .957! A recent, informal partnership with Christians in the *Atlanta Church of Christ in Gwinnett* has leveraged recent grants to some adoptive families as the Gwinnett church has donated over \$10,000 of their own resources toward these adoptions.

Change, in this case copper and silver coins, does help make a difference. Keep that baby bottle where you can see it!
