The Father Facts-Here is some good news:

Children with fathers who are involved are more likely to get A's in school. Children with fathers who are involved are 40% less likely to repeat a grade.

Children with fathers who are involved are 70% less likely to drop out of school. Children with involved, loving fathers are significantly more likely to do well in school, have healthy self-esteem, exhibit empathy and pro-social behavior, and avoid high-risk behaviors such as drug use, truancy, and criminal activity compared to children who have uninvolved fathers.

As those who profess Jesus as Lord and God as our Father, we have a sovereign obligation to exercise our faith at home and then to extend our arms to those in our fellowship and in the community at large. Being a good enough father is one of the most powerful testimonies of God working in your life. Today, we congratulate and honor the fathers of the Athens Church of Christ. We honor our elders and other mature men who distinguish themselves before God by their honorable example. We thank God for Sonny, Don and Jeff, who are fathers to so many. We honor our younger dads who are learning to raise young children. We honor our courageous single dads who are raising kids on their own like my dad did. Reflections on Father's Day By Will Archer

Today is Father's Day. A day we take to honor our fathers. In America, we have 64.3 million fathers. 26.5 million of us are fathers in two parent homes and 2.5 million are single dads up from 400,000 in 1970. We live in a world profoundly affected by the power of involved fathers and the pain of fatherlessness. It is my strong belief that Father's Day is of incredible significance and as a church we honor it. God consistently describes himself as our Father and those of us that bear this honor are blessed indeed. In our fallen world there are sadly too many of us that struggled with the experience of fatherlessness, absentee fathers, troubled or abusive fathers. This often colors our view of God and causes us to experience mixed and sometimes strong negative emotions when fathers and fatherhood is discussed. God knows all of our stories and deep feelings intimately, he cares for all of us. He does not withdraw his distinction as our Father because it may trigger us, but rather affirms and reaffirms to us that he is Our Father. He is Father of Compassion, the Father who disciplines and the Father who invites us to approach him with confidence. He is the Father who fathers all fathers.

Personally, it was my privilege to have a great relationship with my father for the first nine years of my life. I experienced four of those years in a two parent home and 5 of them with my dad as a single dad. Though he was sadly taken from us by prostate cancer on June 24th 1984, he impressed on me the importance of fatherhood. God has used a number of great men to serve as fathers in my life since. The honor of being a father is one of the greatest honors of my life. One of the greatest insights of parenting that I have gained is that God, the perfect example, expects us to simply be good enough as a father. He has realistic expectations and provides us with the guidance needed to be a good father. In a world desperately in need of good enough fathers, God sets the standard and empowers us to represent him to our families and others who are in need. Let us consider the reality of those needs by looking at the facts.

The Father Facts-Here is some bad news:

24 million children live absent their biological father.

90% of all homeless and runaway children are from fatherless homes.

85% of all children who show behavior disorders come from fatherless homes.

71% of all high school dropouts come from fatherless homes.

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
