As you know, it's been hard taking care of Dakota the last 10 years. Unfortunately, my health hasn't been so good since April, as we have had added stress. My husband had to take a new job paying less. We desperately need bathroom modifications (install shower, sliding door, widen entry way) for safety and my continued health. On an average day I lift him at 60-80 times a day if not more, just for his basic care and needs. Dakota weighs 80 pounds and it has gotten harder and harder each week lifting our son. I'm usually out of breath, continued heart palpitations, hurt shoulder, but I try not to complain (just pray for strength each day).
