

## Acts – Class 1 – Your Kingdom Come

1:1-5	Luke devised his two books to turn on the event of the resurrection. Everything in the gospel leads up to Jesus resurrection and ascension, everything in Acts happens because of his resurrection and ascension, and the message of these happenings to the world. There is a new King on the throne and he has declared that everyone everywhere should come before him and bow down because he has proven himself worthy.		
1:6-8	What is the gameplan? What were the Apostles thinking, imagining, expecting? God seems to always turn our preconceptions upside down. Ps 72, 89, Is 40-55 suggest Israel to be the world power. Sent to Jerusalem, Judea, Samaria, the ends of the earth. 1:9-14	Jesus' ascension; relationship between heaven and earth; Jesus ascending to the throne in heaven until the heaven and earth are united in the re-creation. Book of Daniel was heavily studied during the first century because the 490 years (70 sevens) predicted in Daniel related closely to the approximately 500 years since Babylonian captivity. There was a lot of discussion amongst the Jews in Jesus time regarding the prophecies. Daniel 7 prophecy is suggested here by Luke in the way he has recorded the occurrence.	Dan 7: 13-14 <b>Dan 9:24</b>	"In my vision at night I looked, and there before me was one like a son of man, coming with the clouds of heaven. He approached the Ancient of Days and was led into his presence. He was given authority, glory and sovereign power; all nations and peoples of every language worshiped him. His dominion is an everlasting dominion that will not pass away, and his kingdom is one that will never be destroyed. <b>24 "Seventy 'sevens'[c] are decreed for your people and your holy city to finish[d] transgression, to put an end to sin, to atone for wickedness, to bring in everlasting righteousness, to seal up vision and prophecy and to anoint the Most Holy Place.</b>
1:15-26	Restoring the 12;	Ps 69:25 Ps 109:8	
2:1-13	The coming of the Spirit: fire and wind; untamable, powerful; something new. The meanings of Passover and Pentecost; Passover – the God empowered rescue from slavery witnessed and received only by those who sacrificed an unblemished lamb; they departed immediately for the promised land. why Pentecost – 50 days later, they arrived at Mt. Horeb and received the law – God telling his people how they should live and follow him. It is also the festival of the first fruits, the beginning of harvest season. Jesus is the first fruits from the dead, the Spirit is poured out visibly and audibly as the first fruits and the declaration of the time for harvesting to begin. 2:14-21	This is what we've been waiting for; it is all beginning to come true now. The Jews were looking for the Messiah, he just wasn't what they expected. The last days vs. the last day. The times of fulfillment of the prophecies, just not the completion of them all. The death & resurrection of Jesus results in the pouring out of the Holy Spirit; God moves with great power in a new way. First proclamation of the universal promise to Abraham: <u>Everyone</u> who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.	Joel 2:28-32	
2:22-36	David announces the resurrection to come. Jesus is murdered by the combination of Jew and Gentile, Religious and sectarian, the pinnacle of religious government and of worldly	Ps 16:8-11 Ps 110:1	
2:37-41	The plan of rescue; resurrection is the means of rescue from death; not just souls being rescued or death would still hold sway, but bodies too, so that death has no hold whatsoever.		

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2:42-24	The new family		
3:1-10	Power is in Jesus name; occurs outside the gate to the temple; activities are moving from inside the temple to outside into		
3:11-16	Peter declares the power by which the healing was accomplished by declaring the name of God as it was announced to Moses at the burning bush (Ex 3:6). The burning bush was when God began to intervene to bring the Israelites into relationship with him through the covenant. The declaration here by Peter is significant because God is now intervening to bring them into the new covenant through Jesus. What happened before is happening again, only now it is happening through God's servant (referencing Isaiah 53 –	Ex 3:6 , Is 53	"I am the God of your father, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac and the God of Jacob."
3:17-27	Abraham declared a prophet in Gen 20:7 in a dream to Abimelech; the promise to Abraham contained the prophecy of this time: Gen 12:3, 18:18, 22:18, 26:24, 28:14 Peter declares that this is what Moses prophesied: Deut 18:15-19. 4:13-31	Warned by the rulers, the Apostles call the church together and pray to God for boldness, with a confidence based on the scriptures declaring Jesus king, messiah and the Son of God.	Ps 2:1-12	Things have changed: God has installed his king, he has named him Son, He is laying down the rules for how it is going to be from now on.
4:32-37	In Luke 4, Jesus responses to Satan are from Dt.; Jesus proclamation is from Is 61 and Is 58. Interestingly, these two chapters link together the freedom declared in the year of canceling debts (Deut 15) and the year of jubilee (Lev 25) and proclaim the creation of a community of the free where all	Is 61:1... Is 58:6... Deut 8:3; 6:13; 6:16	Consecrate the fiftieth year and proclaim liberty throughout the land to all its inhabitants. It shall be a jubilee for you; each of you is to return to your family property and to your own clan. ### CLASS 1 – General Notes

1. The Gospel of Luke and the Book of Acts is a 2-Part publication. They are linked by design.
2. Approximate date of Acts is 62 AD
3. Purpose stated at beginning of Luke is "that you may know the certainty of the things you have been taught"  
Gospel of Luke: All that Jesus began to do and teach; the Kingdom is coming  
Acts: All that Jesus continued to do and teach; the Kingdom is here
4. "Everything must be fulfilled that is written about me in the law of Moses, the prophets and the psalms"
5. Written as a history and an epic journey in keeping with great Greek literature
6. Major Events/topics: Coming of the king and kingdom, demonstration of power, resistance received, response to message, Jesus' authority, life in the church.
7. Other subjects: John the Baptist, Herod, interaction with rulers, following Jesus, women's roles, godly Jews, godly Gentiles, godly soldiers
8. Themes: Kingdom of God has come; Jesus is King and Messiah; Jesus working by his Spirit; Salvation is for everyone; Resurrection and New Life; Message must be delivered; Grace, Justice & Judgment.
9. Prophecies of the Messiah and Kingdom: Climate of the times, the Jews were expectant
10. Why they didn't see it
11. Resurrection and Ascension
12. Meaning of Passover and Pentecost; How God made a convincing case for the believers
13. How are we like the Jews of that time? What are we expecting: resurrection, heaven, etc. Do we search?
