The Kingdom of God

Structure

- 1. Written as a history; chronology is carefully constructed**
- 2. Written as an epic journey (Greek)**

Jerusalem to Rome

A small band of followers to a worldwide movement

Through riots, shipwrecks, prison, etc.

- 3. Acts: ascension of the king in Jerusalem to the message reaching the emperor in Rome to give homage**

Major Events/Topics

1. Announcement of the New King, the New Kingdom and the New Covenant
2. Demonstration of power at each new stage
3. Identification of resistance at each new stage
4. Carefully repeated & demonstrated responses to the message
5. Clear demonstration of Jesus' authority to direct the church
6. Honest & unvarnished representation of life in the church

Other Subjects Luke Traces through both books

1. John the Baptist and his followers
2. Herod(s)
3. Interaction with rulers
4. Jesus' teaching lived out
5. The influence and roles of women
6. Godly Jews
7. Godly Gentiles
8. Godly Soldiers



Themes

1. The Kingdom of God has come
2. Jesus is the promised king & messiah
3. Jesus is working powerfully by his Spirit
4. Salvation in Jesus is for everyone
5. Resurrection and New Life
6. The message must be delivered
7. Grace, Justice and Judgment for the world

Prophecies of the King & the Kingdom

- When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. **What is significant about the day?** fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them.

The Coming of the Kingdom

Jesus dies at Passover

What is the meaning of Passover?

Miraculous Signs are performed by Moses

Spotless lamb sacrificed

Death Angel passes over Israel's first born

Israelites are freed from bondage

They depart for the promised land

They pass through the waters to leave Egypt

Where do they go?

What happened at the first Pentecost?

50 days after the Passover, the Israelites were assembled at Horeb...

Ex 3:1	God first speaks to Moses at Horeb
Ex 17:6	Water came out of the rock for the people to drink at Horeb
Dt 1:1	Moses spoke the commandments of God to them at Horeb
Dt 4:10	All the people assembled to hear Gods words to learn to revere him
Dt 4:15	God spoke to them out of the fire
Dt 5:2	God made a covenant with them at Horeb
Dt 18:16	The people were fearful of God's voice and his great fire
Ps 106:19	they committed idolatry at Horeb
Mal 4:4	The decrees and laws were given for all Israel

Why doesn't God just talk to us directly?

- The Lord your God will raise up for you a prophet like me (Moses) from among you, from your fellow Israelites. You must listen to him. For this is what you asked of the Lord your God at Horeb on the day of the assembly when you said, “Let us not hear the voice of the Lord our God nor see this great fire anymore, or we will die.” Dt 18:15-19

The coming of the Kingdom at Pentecost

- Standing in the presence of God the new temple
- He speaks to them from the fire
- He pours out living water
- Here now is the new law
- Here now is the new life
- Here now is the message of the servant God promised in Dt 18:15-19
- Festival of the First Fruits
- Begins the harvest season

Acts 2:14-21

Then Peter **Luke records: Peter now begins to voice and explain the prophecies to the Jews – all of you this is what the book is about.** this to you; listen carefully to what I say. These **First proclamation of fulfillment of the universal part of God's promise at was spoken to Abraham** by prophet Joel: “In the last days, God says, I will pour out my Spirit on all people...

Prophecy and the Present

- It is easy to have 20/20 hindsight
- What are you looking for?
- Do you search the scriptures?
- What attitude should we have as we look for fulfillment of God's promises today?
- Example subjects: Resurrection, Heaven, etc.
